FROM FIRST AID



If your child requires any medication (other than Ventolin) during school hours, this must be stored in the First Aid room or staff fridge. The medication will be given by Lynda Stuttard or another staff member as per written consent by the parent/guardian or doctor. Please ensure your child's name, dose, time to be given and route (ie topical, oral etc) are clearly marked on the form supplied at the office. If medication from a script, we need to view packaging to ensure we are giving it to the correct child.

(A template is available at the office)

Children requiring Ventolin need to bring their own puffer to school each day. This can be kept in the classroom for easy access. It is now a requirement of the Asthma Foundation that students using a nebulizer should have their own and not be using a shared one.

We have a supply of disposable nebulizers at school, which will be used if required at a cost to parents of \$7.00.

Our senior school athletics are coming up quickly. Students will catch the bus to Llanberris from school on Monday the 28th of February.

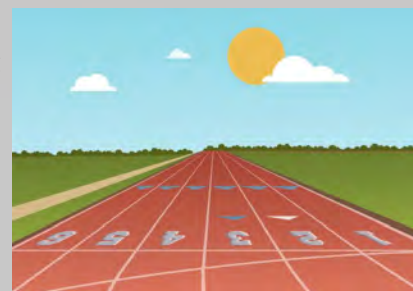
We are currently looking for volunteers to help with events and chauffeuring age groups between different events.

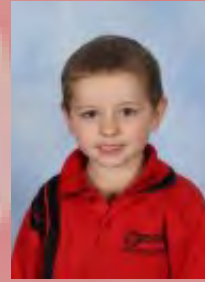
